The purpose of the Center for Service and Learning's Special Projects fund is:

- 1) To sponsor one-time presentations and events to educate, inform and/or support the mission of the Center;
- 2) To provide financial support for new community service initiatives until regular funding can be secured;
- 3) To assist established initiatives to meet special and/or emergency funding needs.

What did they do?

BOB BODOR received funding to buy mini footballs for a clinic the CC football team hosted for the Big Brothers/Big Sisters program, a one-on-one youth mentoring organization.

MISSION WOLF hosted a group of students for a residence hall volunteer program. Funding was given to provide breakfast and transportation.

CREATE received funding to cover transportation charges and snacks for their programs with middle school girls to engage them in creative activities.

TESSA was granted funding to organize a dance party for CC students as a fundraising event to use in their safehouse program, which provides services for victims of domestic violence and sexual assault.

THE STUDENT AMBASSADORS program received funding to cover transportation costs for a trip to Denver to talk to underrepresented students about the prospect of post secondary education.

BREAKOUT obtained funding to advertize its "Art of Imagination" magic show fundraiser in order to raise money for the student organized and led service trips that take place during block breaks and spring break for the CC community.

TRANSCAMPUS received funding to cover the cost of printing materials and handouts to present three workshops on campus and one at an outside conference.

CAMPUS MEMORY LOSS was given funding to provide lunch for its first meeting to discuss the organization's goals of providing support to friends and family who have a loved one with Alzheimer's.

INVISIBLE CHILDREN obtained funding to pay for food, advertisements, and other costs for the screening of "Rough Cut," as a way to promote the new service based group on campus.

EARLY BIRDS received funds to implement a new consistency rewards program to increase volunteer commitment during morning volunteer sessions.

EMPTY BOWLS was provided funding to buy food for its informational meeting in order to increase attendance at the group's yearly event which raises funds for the CC Community Kitchen.
